G-net was founded in 2001. We are a Gifu-based non-profit organization dedicated to empowering the brightest young people from around Japan to make lasting connections and create positive change to revitalize the local community. We offer three core services as outlined below.

Innovative Internship Program:

G-net provides the first and the largest independent long-term internship program in cities and towns across Japan. Internship opportunities bring together dedicated college students, local business leaders, colleges and universities, and national and local governments. G-net's mission is to revitalize communities by empowering people especially younger population in smaller towns and cities. We believe it is fundamentally important to foster committed individuals who understand the need to be involved and socially engaged to promote the development of local communities.

Students in this program receive guidance to secure substantive, learning-oriented internships in Gifu and Aichi regions. At the internship, they will get hands-on work experience while making connections with local business leaders. This program will help them to develop useful skills they need for their career, expand their network, gain confidence by assuming professional responsibilities, and broaden their interpersonal skills through working on real projects.

Recruitment Support:

G-net offers specialized recruitment services using our strong network of local SMEs (Small and Medium Enterprises), our program participants and alumni leaders in Gifu and Aichi area. Our approach is to develop long-term careers of the highly-motivated candidates who would like to utilize their skills in local businesses and to build strong relationships with our clients to help achieve their career goals.

Entrepreneur Support:

G-net supports entrepreneurs focusing on local community-development businesses in start-up stages. We provide seminars and professional workshops to foster partnerships around Gifu area. These seminars are open to college students and provide opportunities to learn from individuals who gained hands-on experiences from the challenges they faced. Our incubation program has been sponsored by Brother International Corporation since 2007.

G-net also is reaching out to young people in big cities including Tokyo, encouraging them to work in community-based or employee-owned businesses in Gifu city.
